ORLANDO



 A new sculpture commissioned by Michael Mennelo has been installed on the public grounds of the Mennello Museum of American Art. The 18 foot tall sculpture by John Wolfe, titled *L'homme* is a companion piece to the previously commissioned *Grande Dame* which is also on the grounds of the city of Orlando-owned museum.



 A 26 foot abstract sculpture titled "Hermes Gate", commissioned by the Art in State Buildings program at the University of Central Florida has been been installed at the Recreation and Wellness Center on campus. Fifty-nine year old, Indiana artist Dale Enochs sculpted the metaphorical piece from Indiana Limestone, powder coated steel and gold leaf.

SAFETY HARBOR

The City's Public Art Committee has developed a Free Art Friday similar to a project in Dublin, Ireland and also one in Pinellas. On the selected Friday, there are little pieces of art hidden around town with a tag saying "Free Art" indicating that the finder is welcome to keep the piece.
